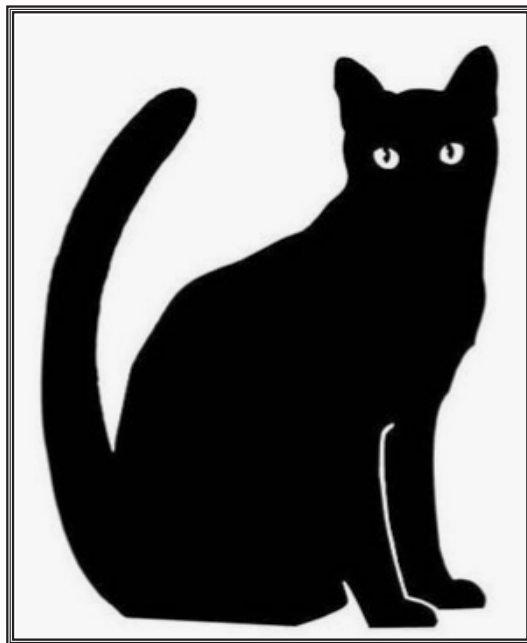

Monday was the day my world went to shit. I was at work when he called and told me he wanted me out of our house. He said I could come over after work and pick up my things, but I couldn't stay. His plan was for me to go stay with my mother so he could stay home and get to know his new girlfriend. What he didn't understand was I was not going to quit my job and go 300 miles away until this blew over. So I got my stuff and took our car and left. Being perfectly honest, this happened two times before. Yeah he would think someone better would come around and he would send me away. It would only last maybe about a week and he would come get me..."



Letter from the Editor:

If life has taught me something it's that sometimes it all comes down to timing. The same applies to writing fiction. When you time it just right, the results can be, quite literally, dynamite in their effect. Just think about it. Think about your favorite stories or movie plots. What gets you the most interested in the story: An action-packed pace with a million characters and plot twists; or perhaps a slow burner with a mystery at the heart. Either way you cut it, your favorite pizza is your favorite pizza.

Write to your interests and model your own writing after the styles and forms and paces you most enjoy. By pace I mean the time in which events unfold in your story or the time it takes the storyteller to tell them. The storyteller might be a cat, a young girl, or the spirit of a tree.

If you enjoy writing, that is musical in nature; make sure your lines--each one--sounds beautiful and lyrical.

Most importantly, fall in love with writing. You can always tell which authors are doing it for the right reasons. Those are the voices you should listen to because they're in it for their love of writing. When that's the case, you can't go wrong.

Finally, know whom you're writing for. Who is the person you want to hear what you're saying? Tell that reader what you want to say in exactly the way you want to say it.
